Jibon Tari - A Journey of Healing and Hope

This April, IMPACT Foundation Bangladesh celebrated 25 years of providing specialized and life-changing healthcare services to the poor, underserved, marginalized riverside communities in Bangladesh. The journey dates back to 10th April 1999, when the first-ever floating hospital in Bangladesh was launched on the bank of river Padma at Mawa Ghat of Munshigonj district in the presence of distinguished guests and dignitaries from home and abroad. Late Al hajj Abdus Samad Azad, the then foreign minister of the Government of Bangladesh, Mr. David C Walker, CBO CMG, the then British high commissioner in Bangladesh, late Sir John Wilson (CBE, DCL), the then chairman of UK Impact Foundation, Late Shafat Ahmed Chaudhuri, the founder Chairman of IFB, Late Mr. Anwarul Amin, the immediate past Chairman of IFB, Mr. Enam Ahmed Chaudhury, Chairman, IFB, Founder Trustees Dr. Rezaul Haque and Mr. Monsur Ahmed Choudhuri and many other distinguished guests and friends from UK, India, Nepal, Norway, Hong Kong were present at the inauguration ceremony along with local guests.

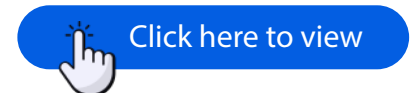


Currently situated at Madaripur Sadar Upazila of Madaripur district, on the bank of the river "Arial Khan", the three-decked hospital provides a wide range of preventive and curative healthcare services at the doorsteps of hard-to-reach, rural communities. The 40-meter-long hospital, staffed with 32 full-time residential staff members, has so far traveled to 22 districts in Bangladesh and offered medical treatment and surgery as well as community engagement programmes, such as training local healthcare workers and traditional birth attendants.

The Project Director from DAK Foundation visits IFB

The training included pre & post-operative patient management. The visit took place from February 24 to March 07 2024.



LHFCT, Hong Kong's support for the “Jibon Mela” Nursing Academic Building

“Jibon Mela” Nursing Academic Building (JMNAB) of the Impact Nursing Institute is expected to be fully ready for academic activities including accommodation for 150 students (50 in each batch) by June 2025.

IFB received significant support from Lutz and Hedda Franz Charitable Trust (LHFCT), Hong Kong, for the construction of the “Jibon Mela” Nursing Academic Building from the second floor onwards.

The construction was launched in 2021 with the support from IMPACT Foundation UK.

Farzana Akter, a dedicated nurse providing healthcare at "Jibon Tari" Floating Hospital

Farzana Akter, a dedicated Nurse serving ailing patients at the "Jibon Tari" Floating hospital was born and raised in Gangni Upazila of Meherpur district. Farzana, a graduate of Impact Nursing Institute (INI), enrolled herself in the first batch in 2014.

Graduating in 2017, Farzana joined "Jibon Tari" the same year in June. Since then, she has been serving patients at the hospital with affection and care. During the last 7 years, she has exhibited determination and passion towards her duties. Farzana has been working as an Operation Theatre (OT) in charge for the past year.

Farzana recalled her early days at "Jibon Tari" stating, "The initial days on "Jibon Tari" were challenging for me, especially, adapting to the new environment and dealing with the emotional toll of staying away from family members. With days, I learned to navigate through the challenges. I became acquainted with my colleagues. The patients feel like my family now."



While reflecting on her journey at the floating hospital, Farzana quotes, "These seven years have been a story of resilience and compassion. I cannot explain how satisfied I feel seeing patients leave the hospital with smiling faces after treatment. When I joined here, I did not know how to carry on for days without seeing my family members, but the endless support I received from my colleagues helped me adapt to the challenging environment."

Farzana's compassion and love towards the patients exemplify the spirit of "Jibon Tari" and its mission to bring healthcare to the in-need patients. While "Jibon Tari" celebrated its 25th anniversary this April, IFB acknowledges the contribution of everyone at "Jibon Tari" who made the last 25 years' journey a success.

Clubfoot treatment



Amir Hamza, aged 7 years, was born to Mr. Moshiur and Mrs. Lovely in a small village at Meherpur. Moshiur earns a living for the whole family by working at a private job. Both of them have two children, a 7-year-old son, Amir Hamza, and a 4-year-old daughter. During the pregnancy with Amir, Lovely visited the hospital regularly. She described that her husband and in-laws took special care of her during the whole pregnancy period.

While describing the day of her delivery, Lovely said, “I was experiencing low water (amniotic fluid), so the doctor advised me a cesarean section delivery. Accordingly, I had a C-section. My boy, Amir was born healthy. The arrival of our first child brought happiness to the family. We were overjoyed and content. However, as Amir was growing old, we noticed that he missed steps while walking. We visited a local doctor, who informed us that Amir will recover as he grows up.

Later, when he was three years old, we noticed the problem worsened. Not knowing what to do, we discussed with many relatives and neighbors about the condition of our son. One of our neighbors suggested that we visit the Impact Hospital and Diagnostic Centre where patients like Amir are treated with care.”

Lovely continued, “We were feeling helpless. The hospital was our only hope. My husband and I took our son to Impact Hospital, where the on-duty Medical Officer examined our son and suggested a series of treatments, including surgery at the beginning and a series of plasters. We agreed for the rehabilitation of our son. Amir went through the treatment procedures as advised by the doctor.”

“Amir is a grade 3 student now. He goes to school and plays with other children. We are happy that our son has recovered. He can now lead a life like any other boy of his age,” stated Lovely.

Lovely thanked everyone at Impact Hospital, Chuadanga for their support. Amir’s bright smile is a testament to the success of the treatment and the love that surrounded him every step of the way.
